

Since joining Beyond Nuclear at its founding in 2007, Cynthia Folkers has focused on ionizing radiation and its impact on health and the environment, from both a scientific and historical perspective. She advocates for fully protecting the health of females and early life stages in the face of uncertain health outcomes.

Her most recent book, co-authored with Dr. Ian Fairlie, *The Scientists Who Alerted Us to the Dangers of Radiation*, was published in March 2024 by Ethics International Press.

Having earned a M.S. in Environmental Science from The Johns Hopkins University, Cindy has been published on the dangers of radiation exposure in the *Journal of the History of Biology* and *BMJ Paediatrics Open*, in addition to contributing essays in two books: *Crisis without End*, The New Press, 2014; and *Transforming Terror: Remembering the Soul of the World*, University of California Press, 2011. She has also contributed articles to *The Hill* and *Counterpunch*.
